MEMORANDUM

Subject: Authorization, Check Processing, and Reimbursement Procedures

Date: March 4, 2026

This memorandum serves as a reminder of our financial authorization and reimbursement procedures. We appreciate everyone's continued hard work, commitment, and the excellent results you help achieve.

Contract Authorized Signatures

The Potentate is the sole authorized signer for all contracts. He will coordinate directly with Amy or myself regarding any checks that need to be issued and signed, including required due dates.

Check Processing

Checks are written every other week and will be available to print once they have received full approval. All issued checks require two signatures, and one of those signatures must be the Treasurer.

Reimbursement Approvals

Reimbursements may require approval from multiple parties to ensure proper oversight and compliance. The required approvals include:

1. The Chairman of the Event — Correctness
2. The Potentate — Budget oversight
3. The Accounting Department — Compliance and Administrative

To maintain accurate records and ensure timely expense reporting, receipts for reimbursements must be submitted to the office within 15 days following the event or pilgrimage. This policy helps ensure that reimbursements are recorded in the appropriate month in which they occur.

These steps help maintain transparency, accuracy, and adherence to our financial procedures.

Notice is hereby given that a Special Called Meeting of Hadi Shriners will be held at the Hadi Temple on Thursday, May 21st at 7:15PM for the purpose of amending Hadi Bylaw 4.7(d) to allow for a maximum annual 4% withdrawal from the Investment Fund and to clarify and simplify the reading of 4.7(d).

HADI SHRINERS SPECIAL CALLED MEETING

All Hadi Nobles are hereby notified that Hadi Temple will have a Special Called Meeting on
Thursday May 21, 2026 at 7:15 PM.

AMEND HADI BYLAW 4.7(d)

The purpose of the meeting is to amend Hadi Bylaw 4.7(d) to allow for a maximum annual 4% withdrawal from the Investment Fund and to clarify and simplify the reading of 4.7(d).

PROPOSED AMENDED BYLAW 4.7(d)

4.7(d) Investment Fund. The board of directors of Hadi shall be the board of directors of the Hadi Investment Fund. Hadi has established an Investment Fund to which Individuals, Groups, and Units, Clubs, Organizations (UCOs) can contribute money or property, including but not limited to stocks and bonds. Contributions to the Fund are not tax deductible. Contributions may be made for a specific purpose and, when so made, shall be used only for that purpose requiring only the approval of the Hadi Board of Directors and notification of the Hadi membership. These contributions shall be designated as restricted funds. The restricted portion of the Investment Fund shall be maintained at a minimum of \$200,000. Contributions may also be made without a purpose being designated. Expenditure of funds donated without designation of purpose will be at the sole discretion of the Hadi membership and for the good of the order; provided however, that use of any funds shall be subject to the following:

(1) Expenditures from the Investment Fund, exceeding that of section 4.7(d)(2) expenditure(s), requires a three-fifth vote of the Hadi Membership in attendance at a Special Called Meeting held specifically to consider an expenditure(s) from the Investment Fund. The notice of the meeting must be sent to every Hadi member and must recite the text of the substance of the proposed expenditure(s).

(2) One withdrawal may be made each year from the Investment Fund. The amount withdrawn shall equal the Hadi annual pilgrimage budgeted amount as approved by the Hadi membership at the Annual Stated Meeting and shall not exceed 4% of the average Investment Fund balance. The average Investment Fund balance shall be calculated using the monthly ending balances for the preceding 18 months prior to the January Annual Stated Meeting. Funds withdrawn from the Investment Fund shall be used for Pilgrimage expenditures for the Imperial Session and GLSA. Funds not used for "Pilgrimage" must be used for expenditures that are for the "Good of the Order" or reinvested in the Investment Fund no later than the December Stated Meeting. "Good of the Order" expenditures shall be defined as Capital Improvements/Expenditures, Building Maintenance and Repairs, and purchasing of necessary equipment.

(3) A portion of the Investment Fund, not to exceed \$75,000, may be used as collateral for a "Line of Credit" in the event funds are necessary to meet day to day Hadi obligations. Restricted funds cannot be used as collateral for any loan. Requirements to establish the "Line of Credit" are: 1. the Finance Committee, in an advisory capacity, shall be consulted 2. The Hadi Board of Directors must approve, by a majority vote, the "Line of Credit" and sign a form acknowledging its establishment.

**The above proposed amended bylaw 4.7(D) was first read at the April 28th Stated Meeting.*

CURRENT BYLAW 4.7(d)

4.7(d) Investment Fund. The board of directors of this temple shall be the board of directors of the temple Investment Fund. This temple has established an investment Fund to which persons can contribute money and property. The contributions may be made for a specific purpose and, when so made, shall be used only for that purpose. These contributions shall be designated as restricted funds. The restricted portion of the Investment Fund shall be maintained at a minimum of \$200,000. Contributions may also be made without a purpose being designated. Expenditure of funds donated without designation of purpose will be at the sole discretion of the membership and for the good of the order; provided however, that use of any funds shall be subject to the following requirements:

(1) Contributions to the fund shall remain as the corpus of the fund and shall not be subject to being spent without a simple majority vote of those present and voting of the membership who are present at a special meeting called specifically to consider an expenditure, or expenditures, of fund corpus. The notice of the meeting must be sent to every member of the temple and must recite the text of substance of the prospect of expenditures.

(2) Value appreciation, not otherwise defined as income, shall be considered corpus of the fund and shall be subject to Paragraph 1, above.

(3) Only income from the trust, including but not limited to interest and dividend income, shall be paid to the General Fund twice a year, payable February 1 and July 1, without prior vote of the membership. Contributions to the Fund are not tax deductible.

(4) In accordance with managing the business and to receive favorable interest rates and when deemed necessary the Board of Directors may use a portion of the "Investment Fund" as collateral for the purpose of establishing a "Line of Credit" Loan. This "Line of Credit Loan" can be established at any Financial Lending Institution deemed to have the most favorable terms benefiting Hadi Temple. The amount of any "Loan" or "Loans" shall not, in total, be more than a maximum of \$75,000, and if multiple "Loans" are established, all "Loans" shall reside at the same Financial Lending Institution. Restricted funds cannot be used as collateral for any loan. The Board of Directors must approve, by a majority vote, the actual borrowing of funds from a Financial Lending Institution and each Board of Director Member shall sign a form acknowledging the establishment of any "Loan." Members of the Finance Committee, in an advisory capacity, shall be consulted prior to any "Loan" being established. A majority membership vote shall be required to borrow money from the "Line of Credit."

This notice shall be deemed to be in accordance with Shriners International Bylaw 331.2(b) and Hadi Bylaws 3.3 and 3.6.

331.2 (b) Laid Over. The resolution must be laid over to the next stated meeting or to a special meeting called for action thereon. The notice of the meeting must be sent to every member of the temple and must recite the text or substance of the proposed bylaws or amendments.

3.3 Special Meetings. Special meetings may be called by the potentate at any time, but notice must be given to each member stating the business to be considered and no other business than that specified in the call may be transacted, as governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

3.6 Notice of Meetings. At least one week's notice must be given of the time and place of all meetings and ceremonial sessions. The notice may be given in the official temple publication or by letter.

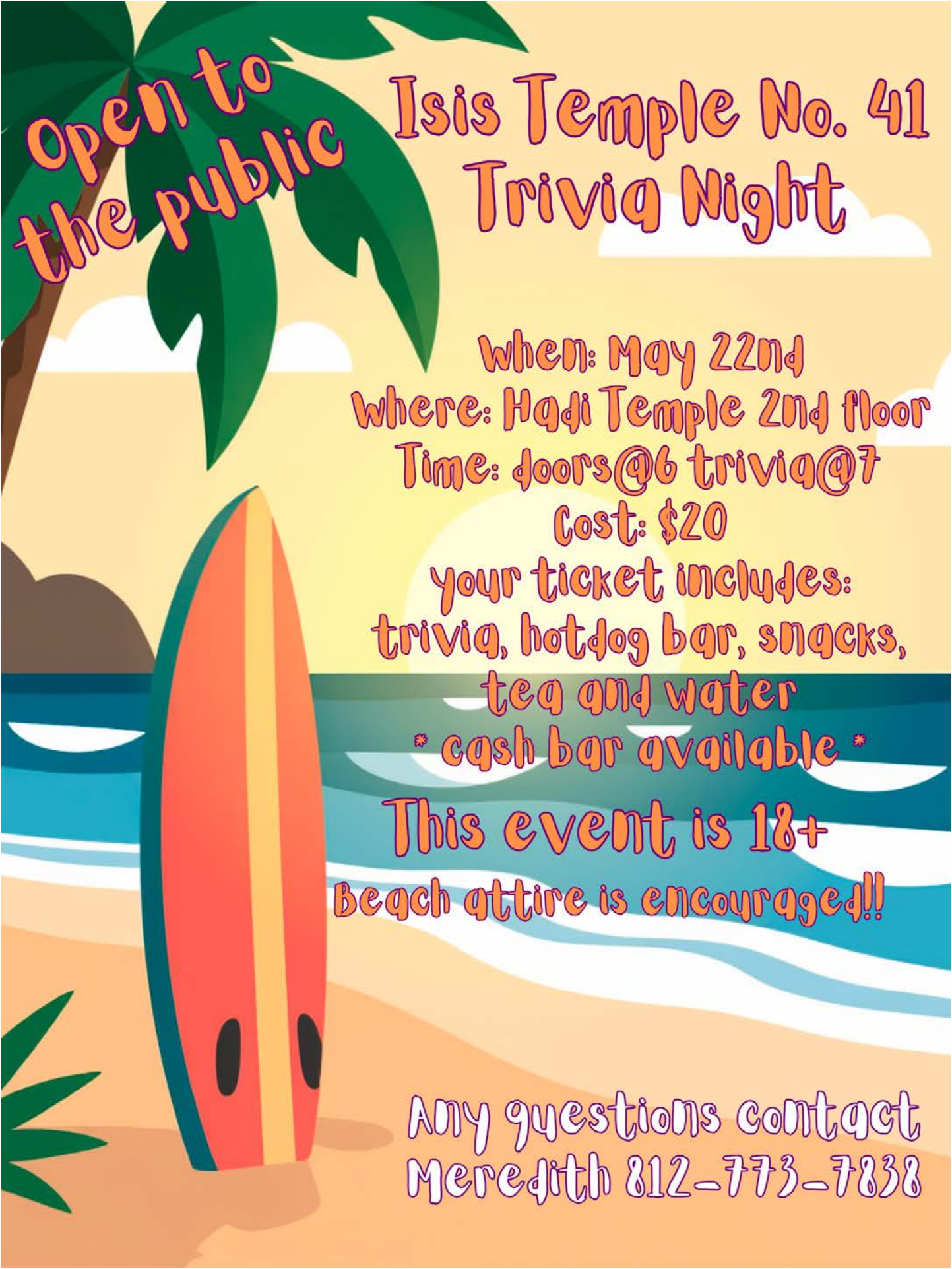

The "To Claim Prize Contact" can be the UCO contact info or Hadi Office. Tickets should be sequentially numbered for security and recording sales. The Ref # changes every year, call office for current number.
4. All Monies received must be turned into the Hadi office. A check of equal amount will then be issued back to the UCO.
5. All sold and unsold tickets must be turned into the Hadi office.
6. A list of all UCO members that sold tickets must be turned into the office.

****The above procedures must be followed in order for the office to complete a required Event Summary Report and to be in compliance with Indiana Gaming laws.****
